1. Pray and then read Ephesians 6:13-17. (You may pick and choose which questions to discuss.)
2. What is the mission of The Church at Argyle?
3. What are the “Five Next Steps” for a growing relationship with Jesus Christ?
4. Some of us are more interested in prosperity, peace and the easy life because we have no intention to engage in the battle. But “Christian” means “Christ follower”.
Why do you think it is not possible to follow Christ without enlisting in the battle?
5. Read 1 Corinthians 9:27. Why do you think it is important to “finish well”?
6. Read James 4:7. What does this verse mean to you?
7. Read Ephesians 6:13. Everyday we are in a spiritual war and the enemy is real.
What is the goal of our enemy?
8. Even though Paul was chained in prison, he was able to encourage us to do three things.
9. Read Ephesians 6:14. In our Christian armor, this belt represents the truth and our integrity.
Why is integrity so important?
10. The life that we choose to live either protects us from the enemy’s attacks or makes us an easy target because we are not living for God. What are your thoughts?
11. What does the chest armor of righteousness protect?
12. Read Ephesians 6:15. As we put on the sandals of peace, we share the gospel of peace wherever we go. How do we do that?
13. Read Ephesians 6:16. Why must we feed our faith and starve our doubts?
14. Read Ephesians 6:17. When God has control of our mind it is difficult for the enemy to gain the advantage in our life. How can we strengthen our mind?
15. If the only spiritual food you get is on Sunday morning you will starve to death.
A human being that cannot feed him or herself is called a baby.
You must take responsibility to keep yourself on mission. Do you agree and why?
16. The most effective weapon we have against the enemy is the sword of the spirit, which is the Word of God. How can we use this weapon?
