1. Read Luke 11:14-23 (CSB)
2. The search for truth is a quest for many people. In our culture, the most popular belief about truth is there is no Do you agree or disagree? Why?
3. Read John 14:6. He didn't say He would teach the truth or show us the truth. He said, "I the truth." Truth lived-out. What does that mean?
4. Some might say that to claim Jesus is the only way is minded. Read Matthew 7:13-14. Does the truth that few will find it bother you?
5. Read Luke 9:23. What is required to follow Jesus?
6. Read John 17:17. What does it mean to "sanctify"? We cannot change the truth. The truth changes us.
7. Why do you think the religious leaders were so intent to destroy Jesus?
8. Read Luke 11:14-15. Because the people were impressed by Jesus' power, the religious leaders had to spread lies about Him.
9. Read Matthew 12:31. By God's grace and mercy, there is forgiveness for all our sin except the ultimate blasphemy against the Holy Spirit, which is to reject salvation through Jesus Christ. Discuss.
10. Read Luke 11:17. What difference should it make in us that Jesus knows our thoughts?
11. How important is unity?
12. Read Luke 11:23. Everyone of us lives and dies in one of these two groups: those who follow Jesus or those who don't. Discuss.
13. Read John 1:17. God is not only a God of truth, He is a God of grace. Not grace or truth, but

grace and truth. Grace without truth misleads people, so it is no longer grace.

Truth without grace discourages people, so it is no longer truth.

The key is to balance grace and truth equally. Discuss.
