

## Argyle LifeGroup Study Guide, Luke, part 84, 01-31-2021

1. Read Luke 22:14-20

2. In our study through the gospel of Luke, we are at the night before Jesus is crucified. In John chapter 10, Jesus assures us that even in the middle of suffering, even in the middle of chaos, even when death is certain, God is still in \_\_\_\_\_.  
Read John 10:17-18

3. The religious leaders did not send Jesus to the cross. The Roman government could not take Jesus' life. Jesus said, "I give my own life \_\_\_\_\_."

4. He was punished but He was innocent. He was despised but He was exalted. He was ridiculed but He remained silent. He was hated but He expressed only love. Jesus was not a \_\_\_\_\_. He was fulfilling the redemptive plan of God the Father in complete submission and obedience. God is still in control.

5. The first Passover meal was when God delivered the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. The meaning of Passover is that God delivers us from the judgment of sin through the death of an innocent sacrifice.

6. Jesus was the perfect, complete and final sacrifice for sin.  
Listen to how John the Baptist introduced Jesus. Read John 1:29

7. The disciples began to fuss about who was the greatest. Read Luke 22:24.  
How did Jesus respond to their argument? Read John 13:3-5  
He washed their feet.

8. Read Luke 22:16. "It" is the Passover meal that commemorates Israel being set free from slavery. As important as being set free from Egyptian slavery was, that is nothing compared to being set free from the slavery of sin and becoming part of the kingdom of God.

9. Read Luke 22:19. This is when the significance of the Passover meal begins to take on a new meaning. Jesus is no longer only referring to the deliverance of Israel from Egypt. Instead, Jesus introduces the bread as a symbol of His broken body and how Jesus would suffer for all people who trusts in Him for the forgiveness of their sin.

10. The Lord's Supper is an important part of Christian worship. It helps us to remember and reflect on Jesus' death and resurrection. It helps us to be ready for the return of Jesus.

11. The apostle Paul wrote about the importance of the Lord's Supper. Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-29

12. Unworthy? It's when we take Jesus' great sacrifice for granted.  
It's when we turn the Lord's Supper into a dead and dry ritual.  
It's when we celebrate the Lord's Supper with un-confessed sin in our life.
